Job Title: Sessional Sports Coach

Salary: £10.55 per hour

Hours: Flexible during school term time, after school hours and half term holiday periods, as and when required.

Reporting to: Sports Development Officer

The job offer will be subject to satisfactory references, proof of qualifications and a DBS check.

Main Roles and Responsibilities

1. To teach and deliver a range of sports and fitness based activities for children and young people of mixed ability.
2. Raising Standards – To increase sporting excellence, coaching and officiating and to assist individuals to progress to sports clubs where they can enhance their skill level.
3. Possess the ability to inspire and motivate all individuals to start or continue playing sport and to improve personal fitness level.
4. To coach and manage various sports teams entered into tournaments and competitions.
5. Assist the Sports Development Officer in key sporting delivery with school based sessions and after school and evening provision.
6. Develop appropriate session plans for sports activities.
7. Undertake administrative tasks.
8. To undertake any other duties as required by the line manager.

Personal Development and Training

1. To attend regular meetings with the Sports Development Officer to evaluate and reflect on practice.
2. To undertake training and development opportunities as agreed with the line manager.

Additional information relating to the role at Coram's Fields

Coram's Fields offers a variety of diverse programme of sports and physical activities for 5-19yr olds during term time and during the school holidays. The aims of all the sport and physical activities are centred on being safe, enjoyable yet purposeful.

The Sports Development programme at Coram's Fields is a mixtures of day time, evening and weekend sports provision all year round with a variety of different sports that are offered to children and young people including athletics, table tennis, gym based fitness and exercise, basketball, multi sports, football and much more.

The holiday sports programme can vary depending on the time of year. This takes place during the Autumn, Winter, Easter, May and 6-week summer holidays. This is free of charge and for all young people aged 5 – 19 years.

The sports project encourages all young people from diverse backgrounds to take part in a variety of different sporting and physical activity in order to improve health and quality of life. The young people are also educated on the significance of physical activity and the importance of leading an active and healthy lifestyle.

Sports Development focuses on the provision and enhancement of opportunities to participate in sport. It is about opportunity for everybody, the disadvantaged, the able, the young, the beginner, the potential star, coaches, officials and administrators. Central to the concept is the belief that all those who take part in sport should be encouraged and have the opportunity to reach their maximum potential.
